A.6. General Project Description

Site: 445 Pine Street, Leicester

Applicant: Susan Shea

Assessor's Map 40 Parcel B1.2

The applicant altered 3,482 square feet of Riverfront Area and proposes to restore 1,203 square feet in order not to exceed 10% of the Riverfront Area contained within the lot. The area which was altered (shown on exhibit 9A) was dominated by exotic invasive bush and vine species. The restoration of the 1,203 square feet will be accomplished by removing the exotic invasive plans: Tartarian Honeysuckle, Multiflora Rose, Glossy Buckthorn, Japanese Barberry and Oriental Bittersweet from this area which was taken out of field production approximately 25 years ago (shown on exhibit 10A). Once exotic species, including their root system, are removed 6 Northern Red Oak seedlings & 6 White Pine seedlings shall be planted and then the area will be seeded with a native conservation seed mix. Restoration of the Riverfront Area shall be overseen by a wetland restoration specialist. The applicant proposes to have no significant adverse effect on the Riverfront Area to protect the interests identified in MGL c. 131 §40 by only altering 10% of the Riverfront Area in the outer riparian zone within the lot.

Glenn E. Krevosky of EBT Environmental Consultants, Inc. delineated the wetland boundaries on 6/21/2018 with 11 A series & 9 B series wetland flags - utilizing soils, vegetation and indicators of hydrology according to 310 CMR 10.55 (2) (c). EBT delineated the Mean Annual High Water with 22 MAHW flags.

The erosion control measure of 9" staked wattles shown on the Site Plan shall be placed prior to site work. This measure shall be maintained in good working order throughout the project until all exposed soils are final graded, loamed, seeded and stabilized with well-established soil stabilizing vegetation.






