We have 98 survey responses so far, and I have attached a prelim report to give the committee an idea of who has responded to see (i.e. 83% of respondents are age 25 – 64 so some targeted outreach to teens / seniors might be warranted!).

Based on the responses we have so far, and to get the committee thinking about goals, we can revisit the attached from 2007 and 2015 and start to highlight goals to keep or adjust. It would also be useful for us to hear about progress on the goals from 2015. Following the public forum we can revisit the list and start drilling down on objectives.

On that note, I'd like to start thinking about the public forum – we have this in our tentative timeline for July. This could be held during the regularly scheduled OSRP Committee meeting that month, or at a date / time that the committee thinks may be more convenient, but we'd like to save a date and start thinking about what the forum will look like. This will allow us to develop flyers and advertise in May / June.



In your opinion, what are the top conservation issues for Leicester? Please rank your choices accordingly with 1 being of highest priority.








In your opinion, what are the top reasons you think Leicester should protect its open spaces and natural areas. Please rank your choices accordingly with 1 being of highest priority.




To potentially raise property values

In your opinion, what are the three (3) greatest threats to open space in Leicester?




What initiatives do you feel are worth considering in preserving Leicester's open space? 98 out of 98 answered

3	Farmland incentives - preserving working farms	51.0% / 50 resp.

5	Food security - preserving local food production (i.e. local farms, local value-added products, local wild food habitats)	40.8% / 40 resp.

How do you travel to open space and recreation facilities in Town?




Have you ever encountered physical barriers to any open space and/or recreation properties in Leicester?






What places should a town trail system connect?




What general area of town best describes where you live?




How many years have you lived in Leicester?

Mr. Reinke calls the meeting to order at 6:04 PM. [Ms. Provencher absent]

1. Final Review of Draft Survey

Ms. Adams explains the changes made to the survey questions after hearing the Board's input at the last meeting.

Questions 3, 4, and 5 Ms. Adams added an "other" option to allow residents to fill in personalized answers. People who take the survey online will have the option to drag and drop the boxes in order to rank their answers. People that use paper copies of the survey will fill in numbers to rank answers.

Question 8: the definition for "universal access" was added so residents know the exact meaning when it appears in later questions.

Question 10: ATV, snowmobile, wheelchair and horseback were added as travel options.

Question 11: The spelling of "Lions" Park was fixed. Girls Softball Field was added to Russel Memorial Park.

Ms. Nist asks if Becker should still be included since the school is being sold. Ms. Buck says it should stay because there are still facilities there that residents use.

Question 12: "Open and Recreation space" was clarified as opposed to just using the word "space".

Question 14 was added to gauge whether residents encountered any physical barriers when accessing open space in Leicester.

Question 15 asks residents to specify where the barriers mentioned in question 14 exist.

Question 19: The term "universal accessibility" was added again.

The remainder of the questions did not require editing.

On question 13 Ms. Nist notes the term "developed" may be misconstrued as building/construction. She suggests changing the term to "improved" or something that indicates the open space won't be disturbed. Mr. Reinke says "created, implemented and/or expanded" would be an appropriate term.

Motion: Ms. Nist moves to accept the survey as amended.

Second: Ms. Marrtila Discussion: None Roll-Call Vote: (5-0-0)

Ms. Nist volunteers to distribute paper copies at various locations around town, and will report where paper copies are left.

Motion: Ms. Nist asks that the name Parliment be corrected, but otherwise accepts the minutes.
